

Royal Yacht Club of Victoria Class Monkeys Regatta 2021 Notice of Race

Royal Yacht Club of Victoria Yacht as the Organising Authority invites entries for the Class Monkeys Regatta 2021 1. Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Yachting Australia (YA) shall apply.
- 1.3 The Class Rules of each of the competing classes shall apply.

2. Advertising

2.1 Boats shall if required by the Organizing Authority; display in locations specified any logos, pennants or promotional material as may be supplied.

3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 The regatta is open to Bluebird class boats, on the register of a yacht club affiliated with YA.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter online at the Royal Yacht Club of Victoria by 1700 hours on Friday 7th May 2021.
- 3.4 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee.

4. Fees

- 4.1 The entry fee for the series will be \$175 (inc GST).
- 4.2 A daily entry fee of \$30 will also be available.

5. Schedule

- 5.1 Racing to be conducted from Saturday 8th May fortnightly until Saturday 11th September 2021 (8th May, 22nd May, 5th June, 19th June, 3rd July, 17th July, 31st July, 14th August, 28th August, (11th September re-sail date) 9 days).
- 5.2 The warning signal for the first race each day is scheduled for 11.55 hours.
- 5.3 Up to two Short Course races are scheduled per day, with the first race a pursuit start on water (based on handicap) and the second race all boats starting together. At least three long course races (with a pursuit marina start) will be conducted throughout the series with one race per day. Long races will be also counted as Pollywoodside races.

6. Sailing Instructions

6.1 The Entrants listing and Sailing Instructions will be available no later than Thursday 6th May 2021.

7. Venue

7.1 Racing will either be conducted on the waters of Northern Port Phillip adjacent to the Royal Yacht Club of Victoria for short course races or as per RYCV Courses for long course races.

8. The Courses

8.1 Races will be conducted on courses as described in the Sailing Instructions or as per current RYCV Courses for long course races.

9. Scoring

9.1 The low point scoring system - Appendix A2.2 of the Racing Rules shall apply. Fifteen races are scheduled, of which 3 shall be completed to constitute a series. If thirteen or more races are completed the best nine shall count. If between ten to twelve races are completed, the best eight shall count. If between five and nine (inclusive) races are completed, the worst score will be discarded. If four or less races are completed, all scores will count.

10. Prizes

10.1 Prizes shall be determined and awarded at the discretion of the Race Committee and the Bluebird Yacht Association Committee, and presented at a presentation function.
