





The Royal Yacht Club of Victoria Inc. invites entries from the yachts of a yacht club affiliated with Australian Sailing. The Regatta will be sailed on Port Phillip under the authority of the Royal Yacht Club of Victoria Inc.

The series is a 2-day event run on 16th May 2021 and 30th May 2021.

- 1. Rules
- 1.1 The is governed by the rules as defined int *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing (AS), Category 6 shall apply.
- 1.3 The Class Rules of each of the competing classes shall apply.
- 2. Sailing Instructions
- 2.1 The entrants' listing and Sailing Instructions will be available no later than Friday 14th May 2021.
- 3. Communication
- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at www.rycv.asn.au
- 3.2 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 4. Eligibility and Entry
- 3.1 The regatta is open keelboats, on the register of a yacht club affiliated with Australian Sailing.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter online at the Royal Yacht Club of Victoria by 1700 hours on Friday 15th May 2021.
- 3.4 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee.



- 4. Fees
- 4.1 The entry fee for the all-race days will be \$60 (inc GST).
- 4.2 A daily entry fee of \$35 will also be available.
- 5. Advertising
- 5.1 Boats shall, if required by the Organizing Authority; display in locations specified any logos, pennants or promotional material as may be supplied.
- 6. Schedule
- 6.1 Racing will be conducted on the following Sundays, 16th May and 30th May 2021.
- 6.2 The warning signal for the first race each day is scheduled for 1100 hours.
- 6.3 Multiple Short Course races are scheduled each day.
- 7. Venue
- 7.1 Racing will be conducted on the waters of Northern Port Phillip adjacent to the Royal Yacht Club of Victoria.
- 8. Courses
- 8.1 Races will be conducted on laid courses of approximately thirty minutes in duration.
- 9. Scoring
- 9.1 Results will be calculated for each days racing
- 9.2 An overall result for all races conducted will also be calculated.
- 10. Prizes
- 10.1 Prizes shall be determined and awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority and presented at the conclusion of each days racing.



11.Risk Statement

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
