Overnight berthing is free for the first night then \$3.50 per metre per night.

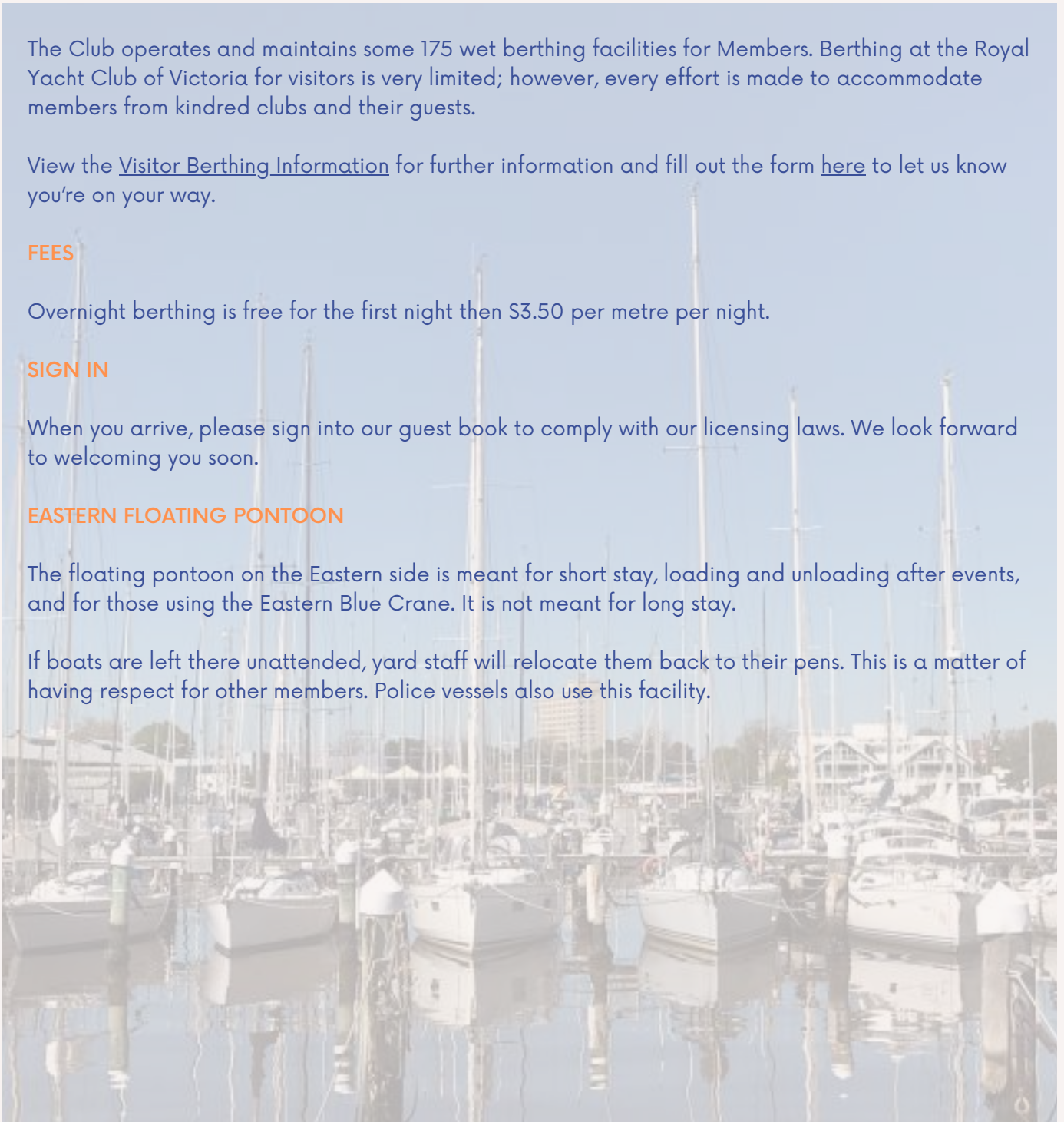
SIGN IN

The floating pontoon on the Eastern side is meant for short stay, loading and unloading after events, and for those using the Eastern Blue Crane. It is not meant for long stay.

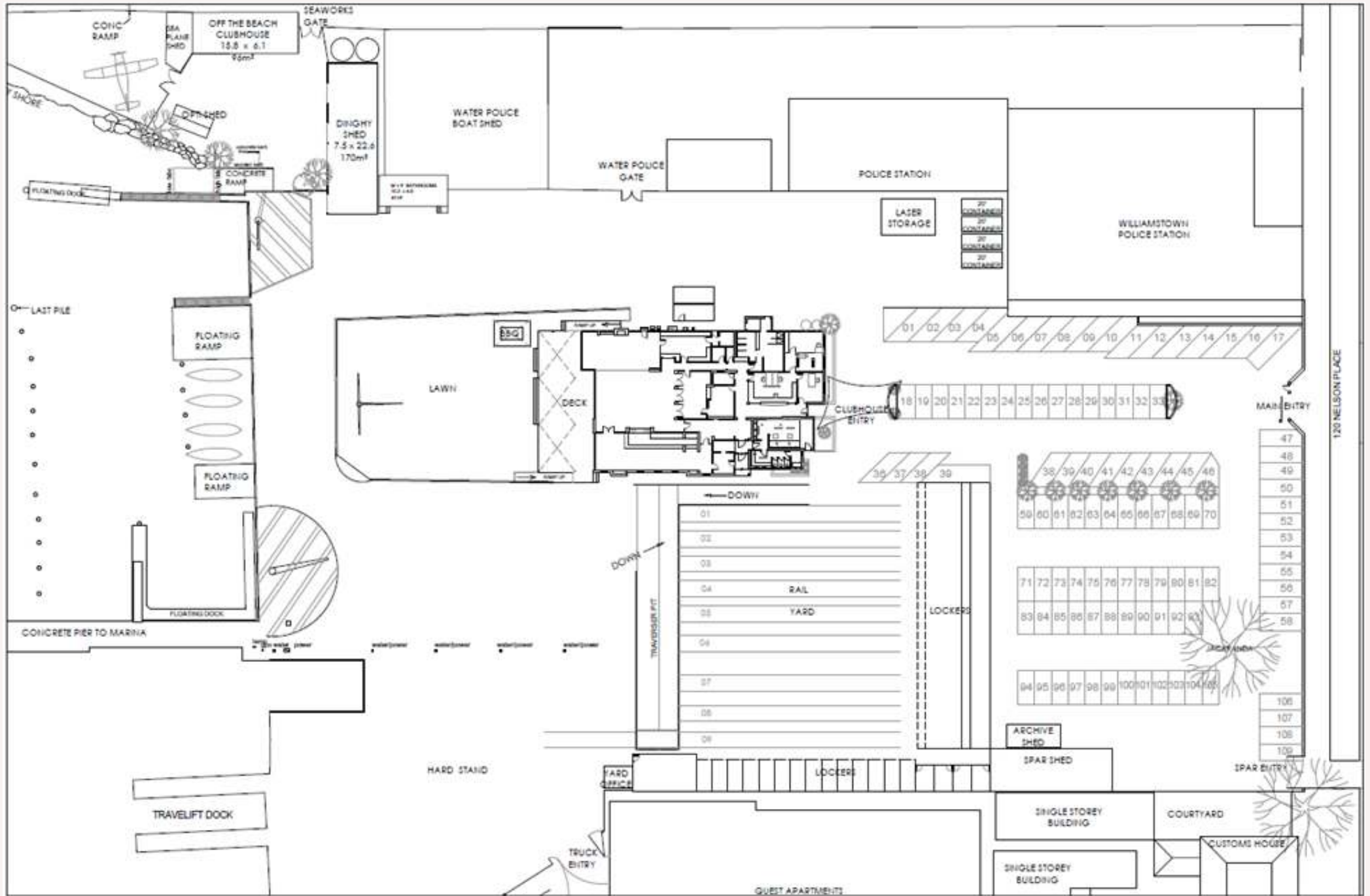
If boats are left there unattended, yard staff will relocate them back to their pens. This is a matter of having respect for other members. Police vessels also use this facility.

SUMMER SATURDAY AGGREGATE SERIES

This series is a selection of 10 Category 6 Saturday races from our sailing calendar.

AUSTRALIAN SAILING RANGE SERIES (PREVIOUSLY NAUTILUS MARINE RANGE SERIES)

The Range Series will be run over three days. The event is managed by several different organisations and offers competitive laid courses at a central location on the Bay. A separate Notice of Race will be issued in due course.

WEDNESDAY TWILIGHT SERIES AND WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SERIES

The Twilight Series begins in October and runs until March. The Wednesday afternoon series is a pursuit start race which starts from 2pm and runs with and without spinnakers. The Twilight Series offers a multi-division format followed by dinner and a presentation on the deck after racing.

TRIBE & ONIONS/STEAK & MUSHROOMS

This popular series offers social racing on alternative Sunday mornings from October to March. The format is pursuit starts, followed by a very collegial picnic lunch on the deck. A very welcoming group so sign up and get involved.

LIVINGSTON TROPHY

The Livingston Trophy will be awarded to the aggregate winner on AMS of the following long-distance races: The Commodore's Trophy to Portarlington; the Palliser Trophy race to Mornington; the Elwood Huon Trophy; the Festival of the Sails passage race from Melbourne to Geelong; the short version of HBYC Sea Pilot's Race; and the HBYC Don Thompson race to St Leonards.

JEFF GRAY FIXED MARKS SERIES

Honouring the late Jeff Gray, this series includes Lord Brassey Trophy, the Lord Forster Trophy, the Elwood Huon Trophy and Awinya Cup. This series has been designed to meet the needs of our Members seeking longer racing formats with both fixed and laid marks.

VAL HODGE TROPHY

This trophy celebrates Val Hodge, one of our Club's first female skippers, and is part of the Port Phillip Women's Championship Series, open to female skippers and joint female/male crews. The Val Hodge Trophy is held in April.

SAILING PROGRAM

RYCV Off the Beach sailing offers Members, guests and visiting boats competitive windward leeward racing on Sundays, starting off on Sunday morning with sailing coaching and training for junior sailors. On Sunday afternoons there are two courses for juniors and senior sailors where competitors compete in club aggregates. Classes sailed are: i14, WASZP, Lasers, 29ers, Cadets and Optimists. October.

SAILPASS FOR NON-MEMBERS

Please note: Australian Sailing requires all crew to be members of a Club affiliated with Australian Sailing (that is they will have an AS number) or another World Sailing MNA. If your crew does not have such a qualification, they may acquire a SailPass as detailed on our website [here](#) For Saturday Sailing it is compulsory to lodge a crew list and failure to do so will result in a scoring penalty. By providing a crew declaration, it ensures compliance with our liquor licensing laws, the Racing Rules of Sailing and to provide insurance coverage. We all share this responsibility and need to encourage our non-member crew, who enjoy the privileges of our Club, to sign up for membership and contribute to our running costs.

ANNUAL SAFETY DECLARATION

All boats on the Club's Yacht Register must complete a Safety Declaration each season whether they are sailing or not. All safety and compliance declarations lapse on 30 June each year. The annual safety declaration forms and instructions are available on the Club's sailing webpage under Safety and Registration. Hardcopy forms are also available from the office. When you return the Safety Audit to the Club's office you will be given a sticker to fix to the transom of your boat which must be displayed during racing events. The Sailing Committee will be conducting safety audits prior to racing to demonstrate our commitment to the safety of our Members.

SAILING PROGRAM



MAN OVERBOARD (MOB) DRILL

We sail in an exciting sport, but not without its risk. A well-practiced MOB procedure is critical to minimising the risk of fatalities and conducting MOB drills is an essential part of your annual safety declaration and responsibility as a boat owner. Please ensure that your MOB procedure is designed for your boat and documented so that your crew is familiar with your safety equipment and procedures, and competent in recovery manoeuvres. Regular training is available via the Club's training webpages. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Ian Fox or Andy Warner who will be able to provide advice and support. Safety comes first.

VHF RADIOS

Please note it is a requirement that boats carry a VHF radio either fixed or handheld, and that a trained VHF radio operator must be on board to operate the radio as required. The Club offers regular VHF Radio Operator training which can be booked via the Club's training webpages. Radio communication is a critical for component of successful recovery operations and is very useful in race management.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

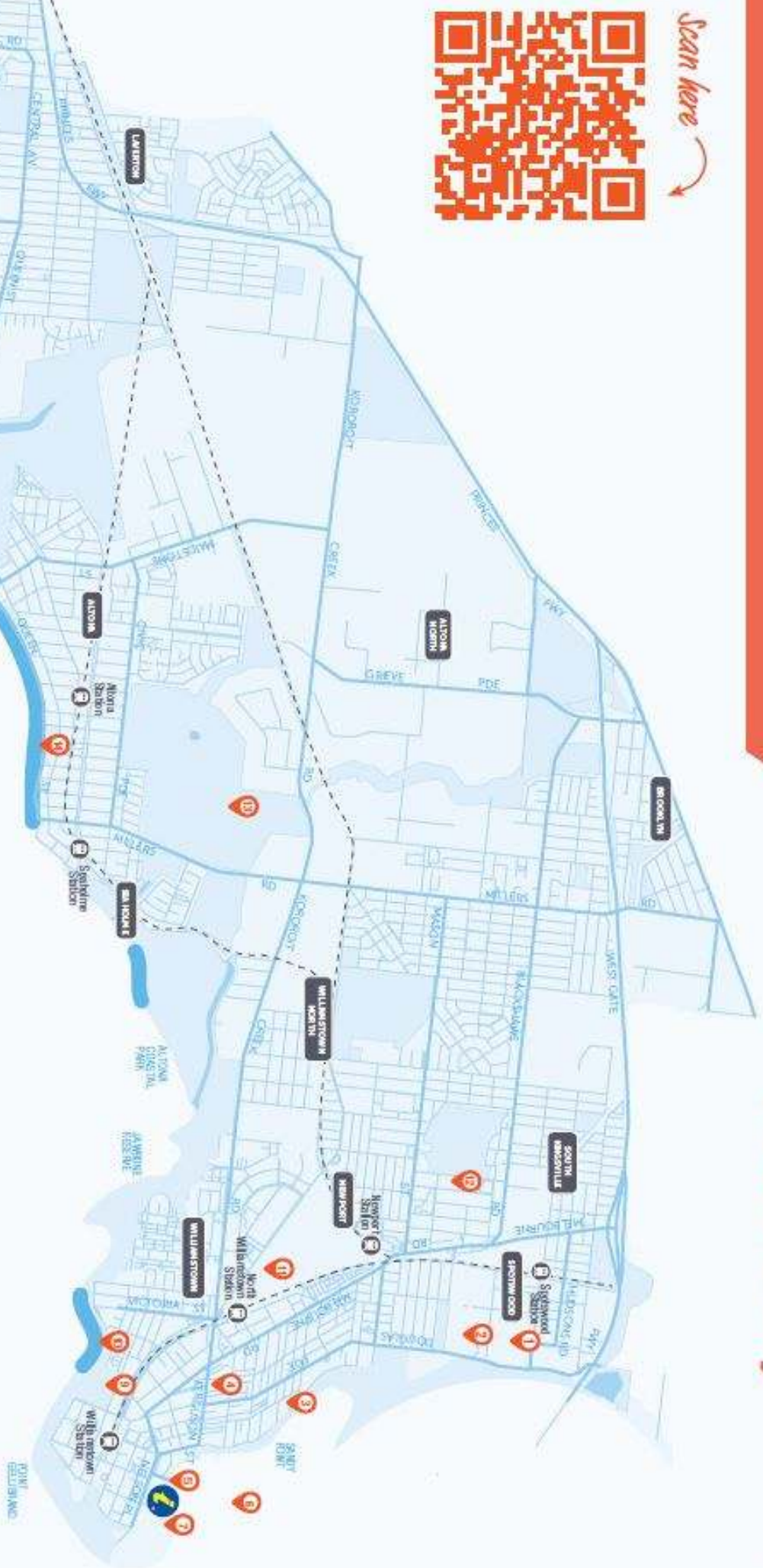
Williamstown has 2 railway stations one within a 10 minute walk from the RYCV. On late evenings and weekends, trains will operate between Williamstown and Newport only with a connecting train at Newport. Trains then operate to Flinders Street, operating via the City Loop on weekends. Trains operate between Newport and city approximately every 10 minutes Monday to Friday.

Buses also connect with surround suburbs, major shopping centres and train stations.

Ferries run daily from Gem Pier (next door to the Yacht Club) via the Yarra River which runs through the heart of Melbourne's CBD.

13. Walk the 100 steps to federation and take in the views over the Bay and across to the You Yangs. Truganina Coastal Park, Altona Meadows.



14. Take the skateboards and BMX bikes to one of two skate parks.



15. Explore further afield and hop on the West Gate punt to Port Melbourne. Travelling under the famous West Gate Bridge.*

16. Play a game of badminton at the Altona Badminton Centre, 271 Mason Street, Altona North.

17. Check out Seaworks Maritime Museum and Discovery Centre on Nelson Place, Williamstown. Here you can immerse yourself amongst impressive display of artefacts and models that showcase maritime history.*

18. Challenge yourself at Scienceworks in Spotswood, and see the Pumping Station, current exhibition, Melbourne Planetarium, and Lightning Room.

DRESS CODE

- Sailing gear, mobile phones and caps *are* permitted on the deck
- The dress code may be relaxed from time to time during specific events at the discretion of Club Management/Officer of the Day

BEHAVIOUR CODE

- Parents are responsible for the decorum of their children at all times
- For safety reasons children and others are required to always wear shoes
- It is expected that Members clean the BBQ and surrounding area after use
- Polite etiquette and respectful behaviour always

GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

- Dogs are not permitted inside the Clubhouse or on the deck at any time
*(assistance animals are an exemption)
- For the enjoyment of your fellow members & guests, please refrain from using your mobile phone in the dining room & members bar areas (For the purpose of this By-law, "use" means verbal communication only)
- All guests must be signed in by a Member
- NO BYO alcohol
